

#### Description of Designated Supports and Accommodations for Smarter Balanced and Next Generation Science Standards Assessments

This quick guide was developed for Planning and Placement Teams and Section 504 Teams to provide an explanation of the types of accessibility supports available and a general description of designated supports and accommodations available for state-wide testing. Please refer to the <u>CSDE Assessment Guidelines</u>, and other resources included in this document, for a more detailed explanation of accessibility features.

## What are designated supports and how can they help students with access needs on the Smarter Balanced and Next Generation Science Standards Assessments?

The diversity of student needs is complex. Therefore, accessibility supports for state-wide assessments are also extensive. There are three categories for grouping supports based on student characteristics, need, and independence. They include Universal Tools, Designated Supports, and Accommodations. Within each of these groups there are two general types of accessibility features: digitally embedded and non-embedded.

**Universal Tools** are accessibility features of the assessment that are either provided as digitally delivered embedded components of the Test Delivery System or provided separately from the digital platform as a non-embedded tool. Universal tools are available to all students based on student preference and selection. Use of universal tools yield valid scores that meet the requirements for participation and assessment identified in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) when used in a manner consistent with state guidelines (refer to the <a href="CSDE Assessment Guidelines">CSDE Assessment Guidelines</a> for more information). Embedded universal tools are automatically built into the student's online test, therefore they do not need to be pre-set in the Test Information Distribution Engine (TIDE). However, use of these tools is optional and can remain unselected if they are a distraction to the student.

**Designated Supports** are those accessibility features available for use by any student for whom the need has been indicated by an educator team with input from the parent/guardian and student. If these supports are selected for use on statewide assessments, they should also be consistently embedded and accessed in the student's instructional setting. It is recommended that a consistent process in each district be used to determine and communicate decisions regarding these supports for individual students. All educators making these decisions should be trained by their School or District Administrator in this determination process and should be made aware of the range and types of designated supports available.

Accommodations are changes in procedures or materials that increase equitable access during assessment. Unlike universal tools or designated supports, accommodations are available only for students for whom there is documentation of the need in an Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Section 504 Plan. Assessment accommodations generate valid assessment results for students who need them; they allow these students to show what they know and can do. These accommodations should be consistently embedded and accessed in the student's instructional setting.

In exceptional circumstances, there may be a student whose disabilities are such that the allowable embedded and/or non-embedded accommodations described in this document provide insufficient access to the content in the assessment. In such cases, non-standard accommodations may be appropriate. The provision of such accommodations is based on documented need in an IEP or 504 Plan and must be requested for use on statewide assessments. While these accommodations may be considered "non-





standard" in a standardized test setting, they may be quite appropriate for use during instruction and outside the classroom setting. These non-standard accommodations, also known as special documented accommodations, include but are not limited to the provision of a human reader or signer, or a scribe to support written communication when the embedded speech-to-text accommodation is not appropriate. These accommodations require testing in an individual test setting and may require additional training for the test administrator.
